Steve Jobs wrote and delivered the commencement speech " Stay Hungry, Stay Foolish. " to the graduates of Stanford University on June 12, 2005. The style and content are very different from his Apple product launch presentations, but no less worthy of study. Noteworthy elements of this wonderful speech include:

On June 12, 2005, Steve Jobs gave his first—and only—commencement address, to the 114th graduating class at Stanford University, an audience of approximately 23,000.
